

Over the past few years, WOESA has been by the supported Department of Energy (DoE) by hosting a variety of Road shows with the aim of highlighting possible business opportunities for women in the oil and energy sector. The most recent one was held at the Burgers Park hotel in Pretoria on the 20th of March 2012 and was attended by a variety of women from different organizations namely Woesa, the South African Women Entrepreneurs Network (SAWEN) as well as the Business Women's Association (BWA). The

included session presentations from representatives of different departments in the DoE and addressed topics such as renewable energy in terms of what drives this sector, the governments different and role, programmes currently underway in this sector, independent power producer projects - the background, legislature surrounding becoming an IPP as well as current projects and opportunities, petroleum licensing - the processing involved in acquiring a license to trade and finally the processes for acquiring funding for special projects and the role which the **National Empowerment fund** could play in assisting these women reach their potential.

With over 100 women present, the event was very interactive as many discussions took place over the role which the DoE plays in creating opportunities for women as well as how can women who have just entered the industry get involved with very few resources. It was once again a platform for women to be heard and for them gain insight into a way forward.

WHATS HAPPENING IN THE INDUSTRY:

AFRICAN MINERAL AND ENERGY FORUM

WOESA has been in partnership with The African Mineral and Energy Forum (AMEF) for many years. Amef is a platform for people in the Oil and Energy sector to be heard, to have their say in legislature as well as assist people in gaining an understanding of the industry.

AMEF prides itself on being the think tank for the industry, the place where 'industry captains' go to pull ideas from one another to form recommendations on certain topics. The chairman of AMEF, Mr Maurice Radebe is a well known name in the industry as he is also the chairman of Sasol Oil and Executive of Sasol Limited. Our very own CEO Ms

Khumo Ntlha is also a trustee of A and AMEF is often the programme director at these sessions. The last think tank session was held on the 13 of April 2012 to look at the National Development Plan. Inputs and recommendations on this topic made by WOESA as well as other opinion leaders in the industry will then be sent for consideration to Mr Trevor Manual. At a previous session held on the 2nd of February 2012, WOESA once again had the opportunity to contribute to the discussions on the B-BBEE Bill Amendment and the implications for the Liquid Fuel Charter. The Deputy Minister of the DTI, Ms Elizabeth Thebethe.

gave a key note address which was then followed bv presentations from key representatives in the industry. Thereafter a workshop was held to discuss key issues such clarity on definitions, as governance, monitoring and enforcement, cost of complexity of compliance and legislation alignment and consistency. AMEF as an industry platform is a wonderful way for WOESA members to not only learn about the industry but also a great opportunity to network and be involved in relevant industry discussions. GETTING TO KNOW YOUR INDUSTRY

Renewable energy makes its mark

As women in the energy sector it is beneficial for us to get to know more about the different forms of energy which we can get involved in. Renewable energy has а hot topic been discussion lately as the world moves towards looking at cleaner methods of producing energy. There various types are renewable energy which one could get involved in namely:

<u>Solar</u>

Solar power refers to the energy produced with the use of Photovoltaics (PV) cells. These PV cells make use of direct sunlight to generate electricity. The material which is used for the chips, much like those found in computer chips, frees the electrons from their atoms and allows them to generate electricity.

Biomass/Bioenergy

Biomass fuels generates energy by burning biomass fuels in burners which heat water that causes steam turbines to turn. Biomass fuels stem from industrial processing such as forestry and wood products, agriculture, construction and transportation.

Geothermal Energy

This energy stems from naturally occurring steam and hot water under the earths surface which is used to turn turbines and in turn generates electricity.

Wind Energy

A wind turbine is used to convert kinetic energy (motion) of the wind into mechanical energy which is used to generate power.

Hydropower

Hydropower generates power by converting flowing water into usable energy. Did you know that WOESA has shares in a hydro power plant in the Free State. Hydro power is one of the largest sources of renewable energy in the world.

So now that you know a little more about renewable energy, how does it benefit you. Although power plants cannot be built by all, South Africa's Integrated Resource Plan for the energy sector anticipates 3 725 MW of renewable energy being added to the country's power mix over the coming few years. This is your chance to think of a creative way to start your journey in renewable energy.

Another area which we would like to equip our members is in the field of trading in fuels and oils, so if you are interested give the office a buzz.


• WOESA's 10th Year Anniversary
